Ex: Replace aging buses, maintain bus shelters

Ex: Continue current operations, add bus pullouts to roadways

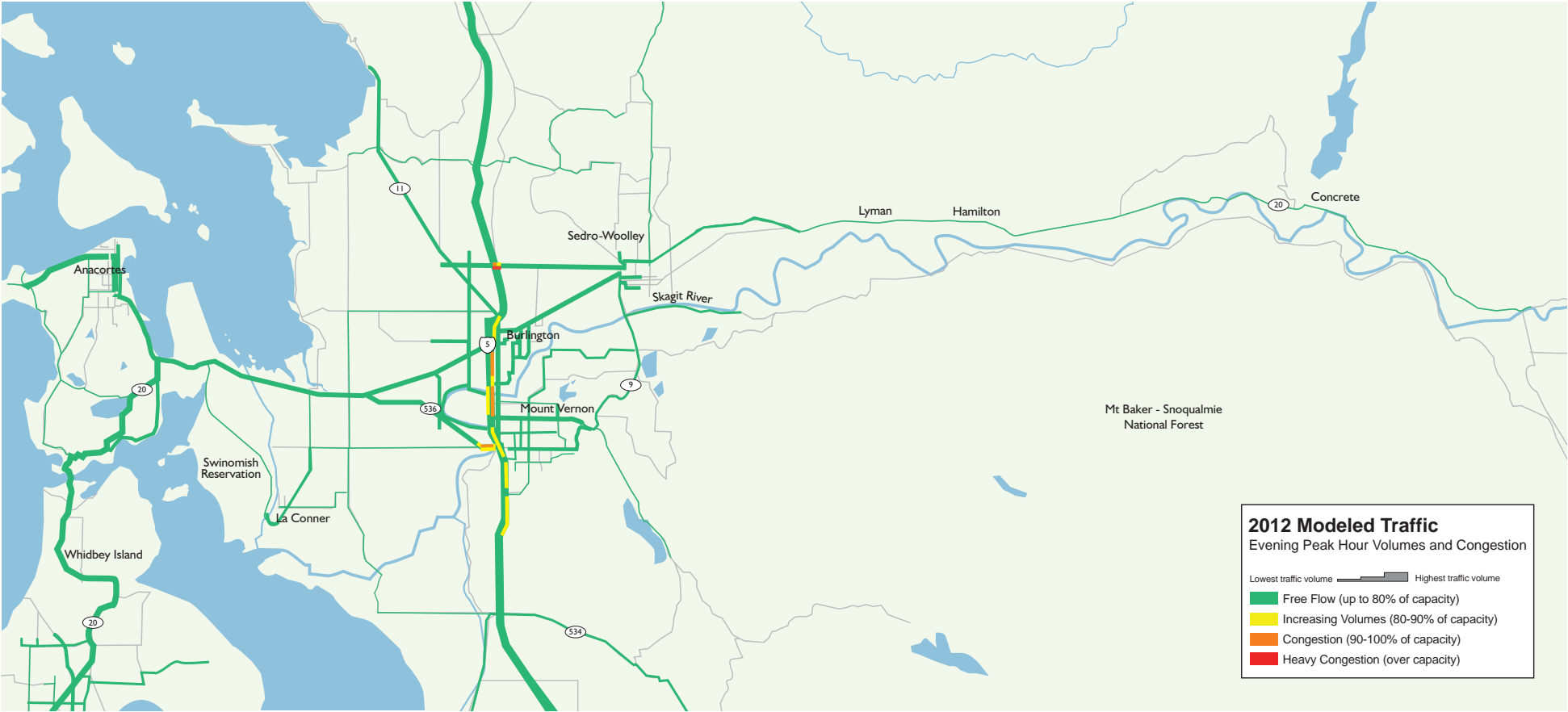
Ex: Resurface trails, fix aging sidewalks
