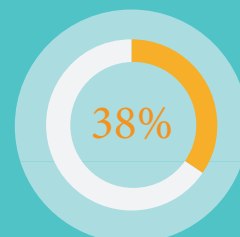

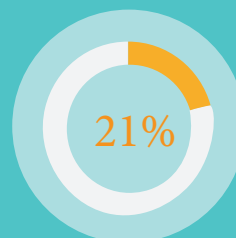

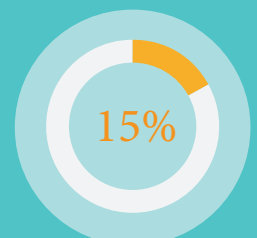
## From Overseas: New International Residents by Continent

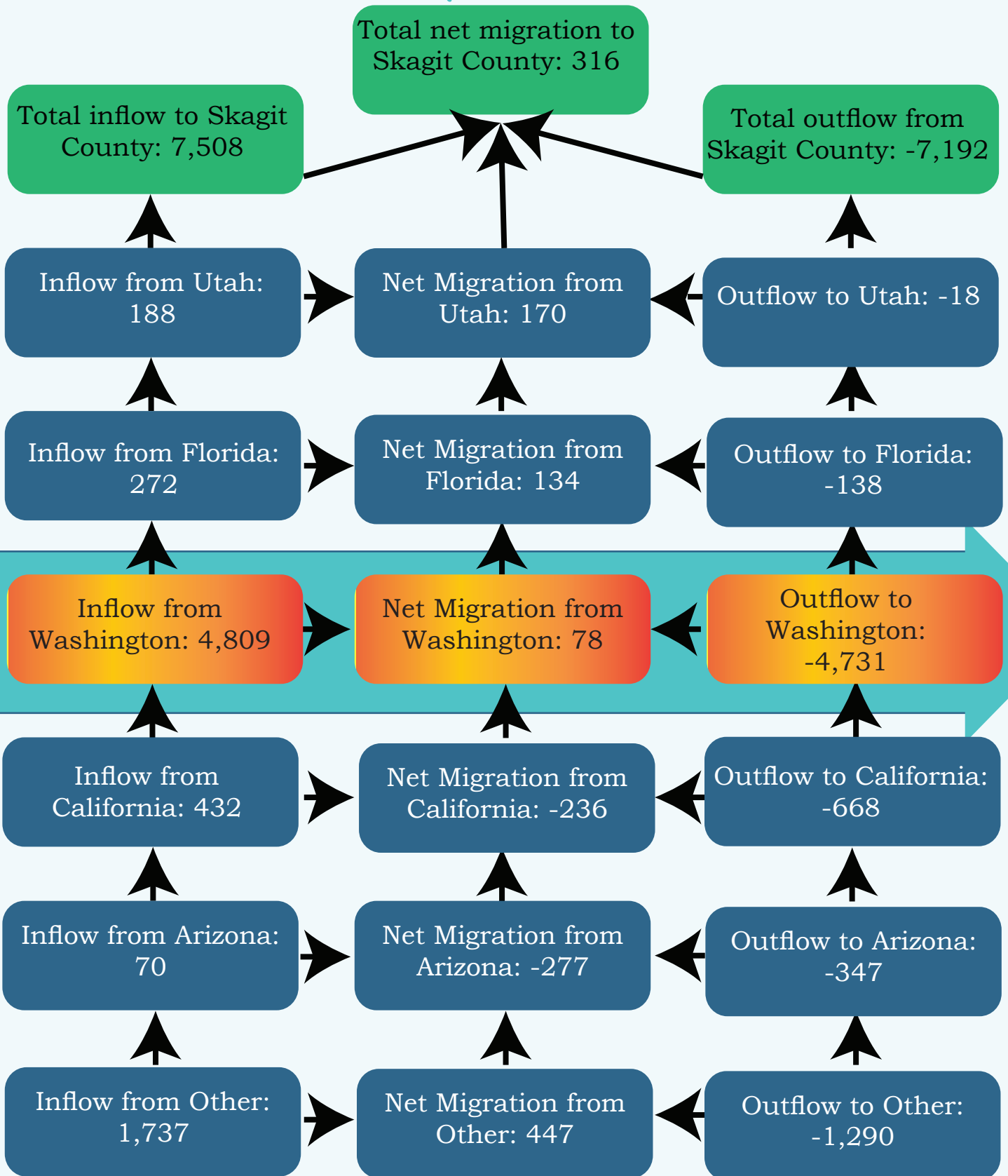

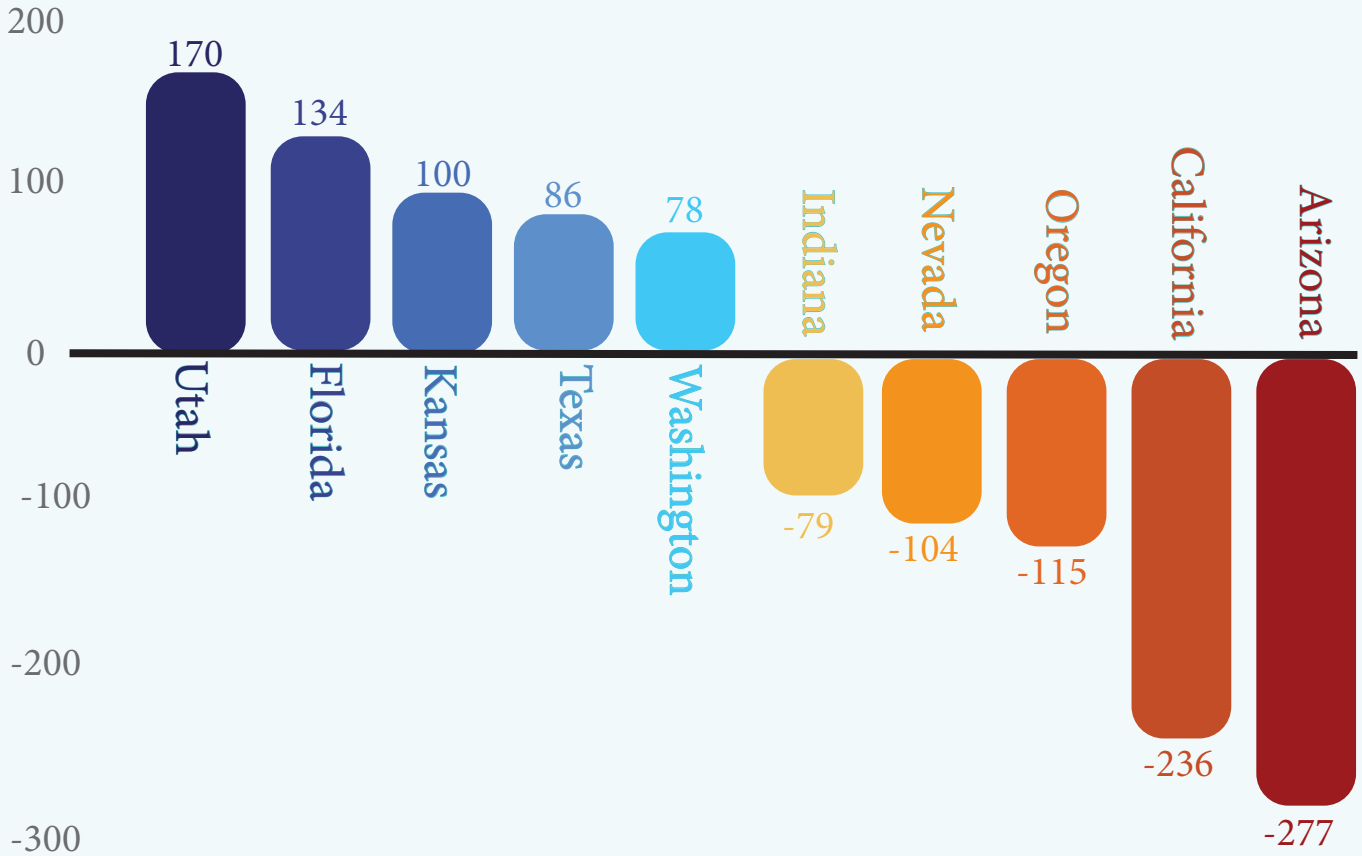

# Flow of Residents to and from Skagit County by State

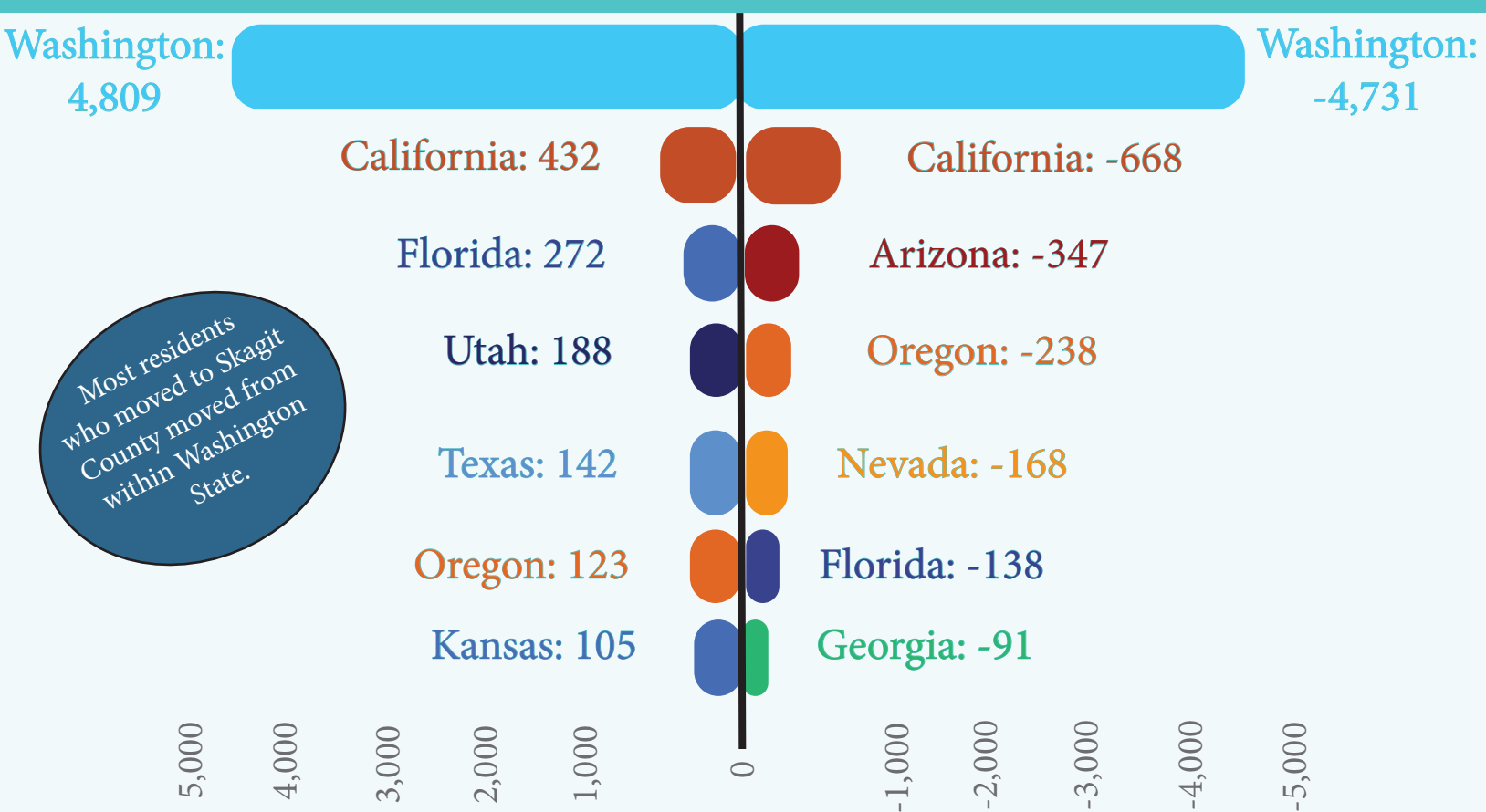


# Strongest Net Migration to Skagit County by State



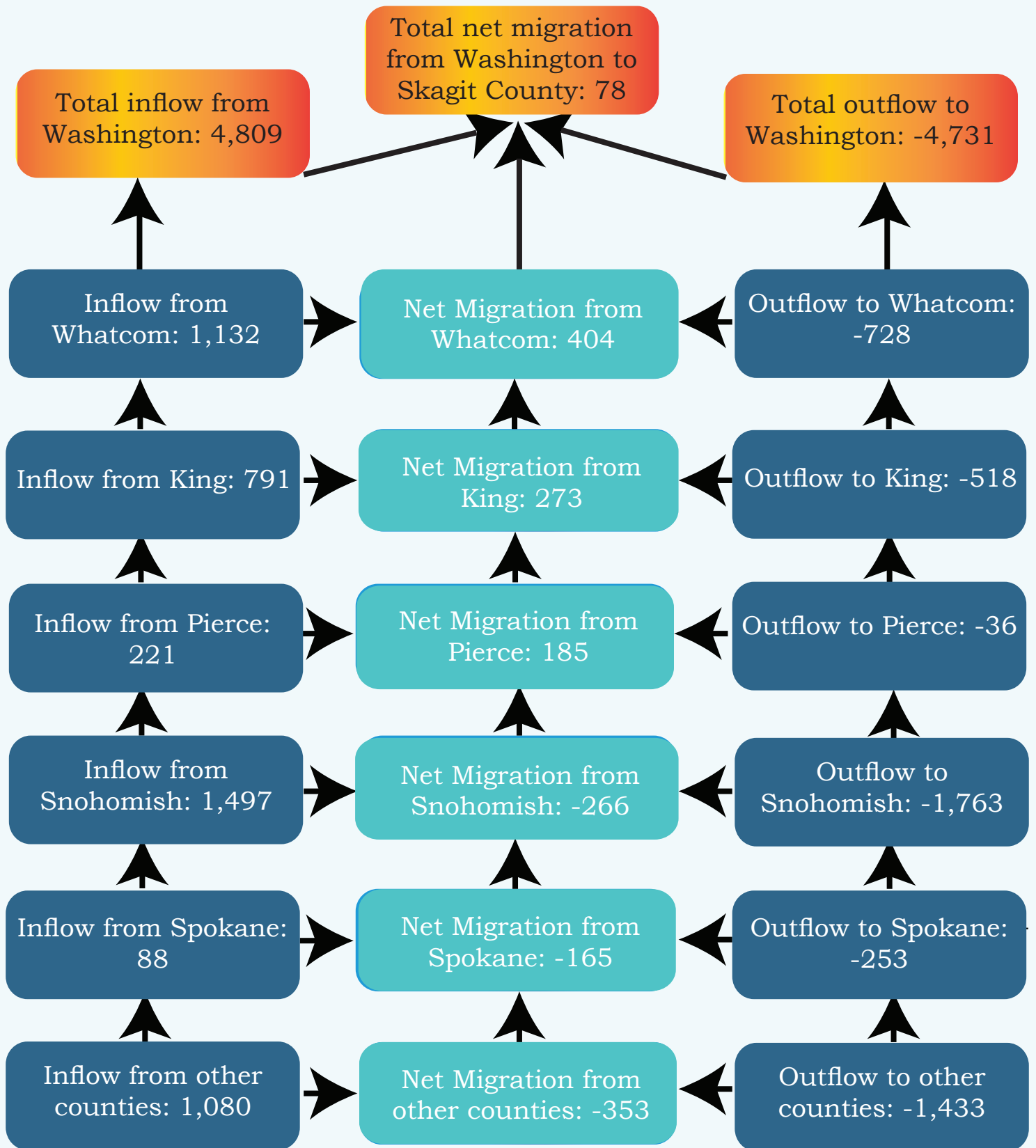
## Inflow to Skagit County by State

## Outflow from Skagit County by State

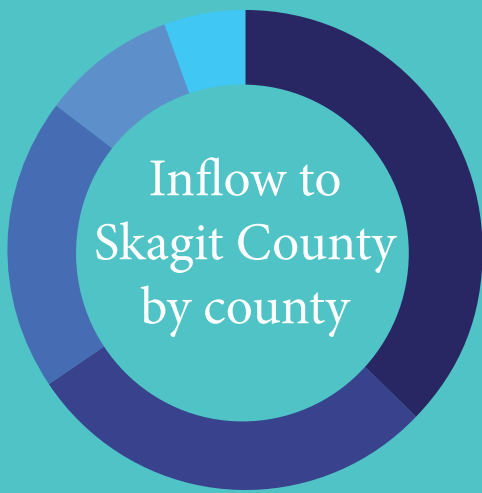
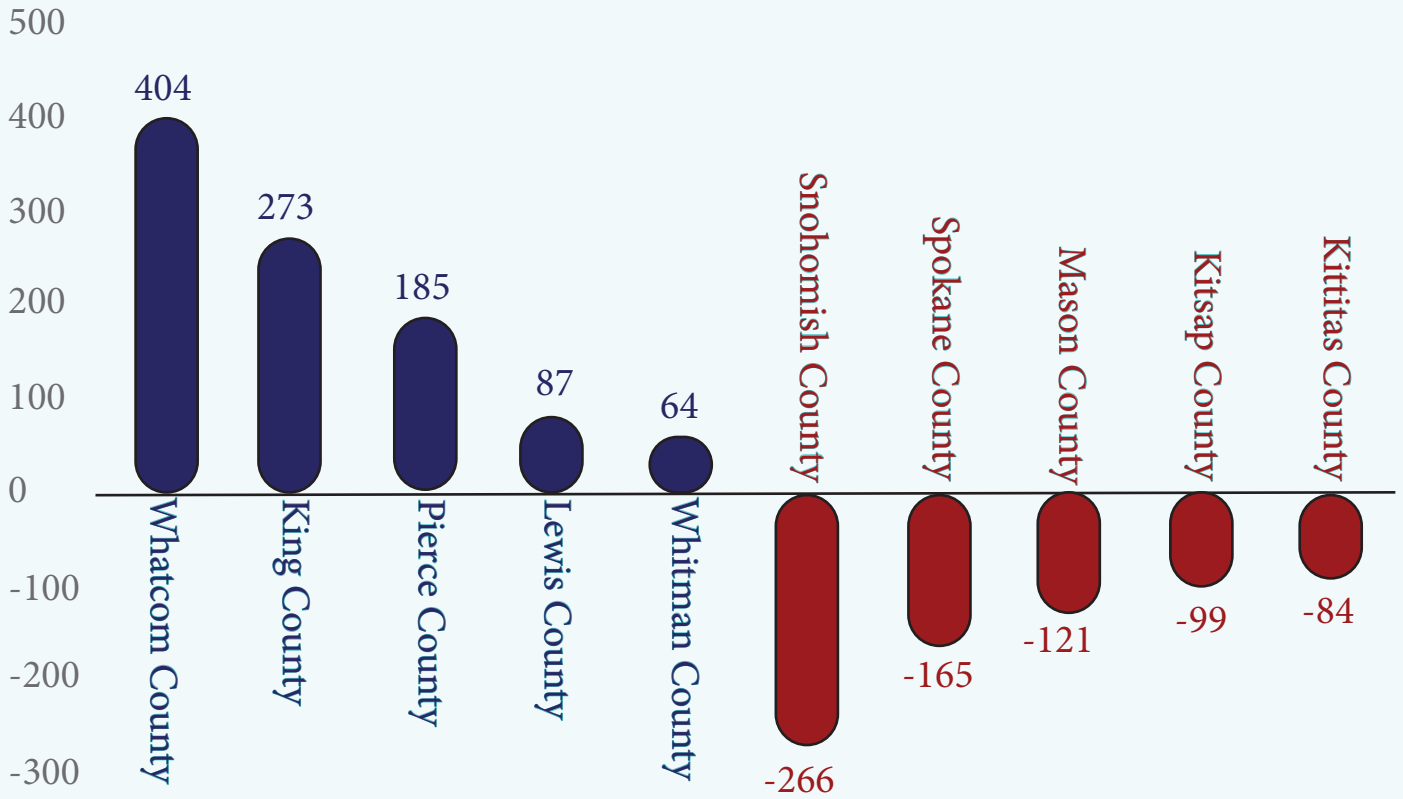


Most residents who moved to Skagit County moved from within Washington State.
